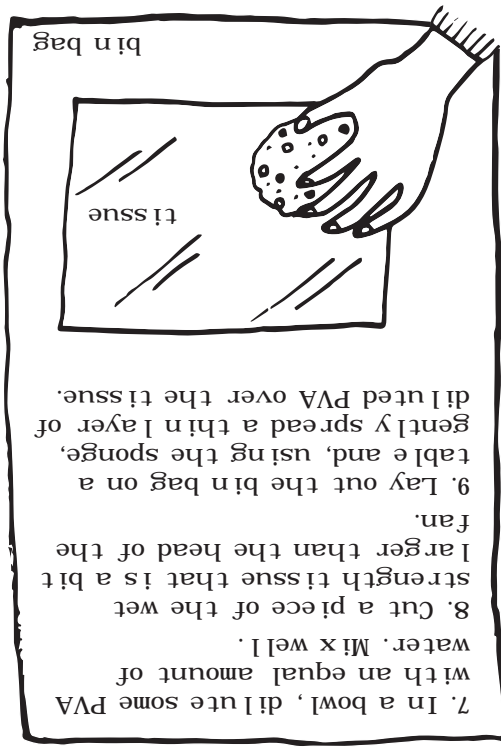
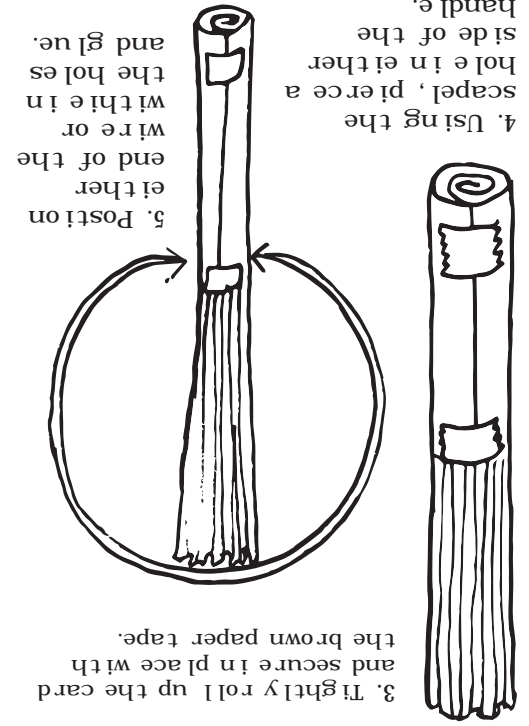
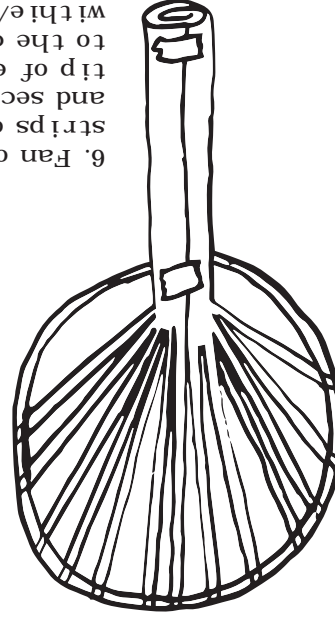


10. Trim the tissue close to the edge of the fan and smooth the edges around the wire with a bit of PVA. It will look a bit baggy. It will tighten up as it dries.
11. Allow to dry and repeat on the other side.

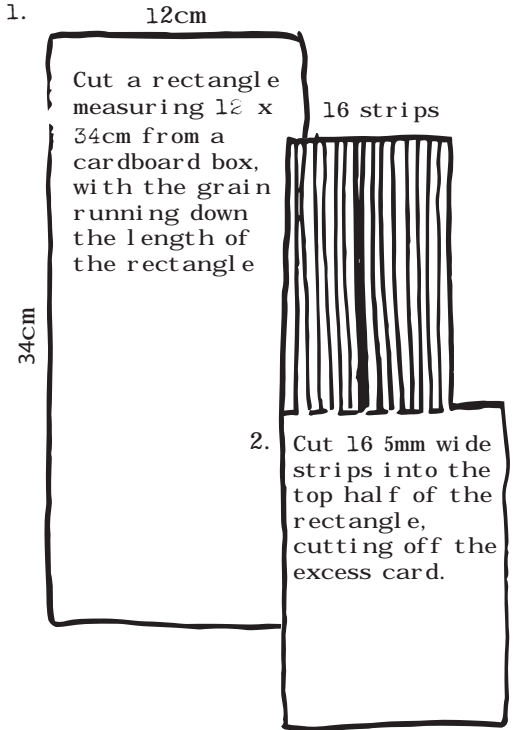


7. In a bowl, dilute some PVA with an equal amount of water. Mix well.
8. Cut a piece of the wet strength tissue that is a bit larger than the head of the fan.
9. Lay out the bin bag on a table and, using the sponge, gently spread a thin layer of diluted PVA over the tissue.

6. Fan out the strips of card and secure the tip of each one to the circle of withie/wire with small pieces of masking tape.



3. Tightly roll up the card and secure in place with the brown paper tape.



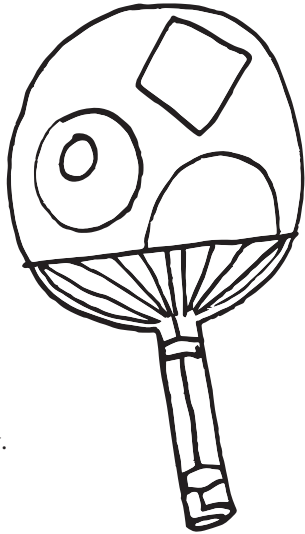
1. Cut a rectangle measuring 12 x 34cm from a cardboard box, with the grain running down the length of the rectangle.

2. Cut 16 5mm wide strips into the top half of the rectangle, cutting off the excess card.

12. Decorate by gently applying more diluted PVA to the fan and laying coloured shapes on top.

Sponge a bit more PVA onto the shapes to secure them, being careful not to smudge the colour (which can run on some tissue papers).

Leave to dry.



YOU WILL NEED

MATERIALS

A rectangle of corrugated card measuring 12 x 34 cm
Wet strength tissue paper* (I used white)
A 77cm length of withie** or wire (a wire coathanger would do)
PVA glue
Brown paper tape
Scraps of coloured tissue
Masking tape

TOOLS

Scalpel
Scissors
Old sponge
Wire cutters
A bin bag

** If using a withie, soak it before hand so that it bends easily.
